Support Item	Eligibility 2020-21
Travel	<p>You can apply for help with travel if you live 1.5 miles from the college centre where your classes are/placement.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">and</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You must be enrolled for a minimum of 6 hours a week <p style="text-align: center;">and</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You must have a household income of under/up to £25,000.00. <p>Points to Note</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You will be asked to make a £20 contribution each term for this pass. • If you lose your pass, you will be required to pay £45 for a replacement to be issued. • Termly passes will only be renewed if you meet the 90% attendance requirement.
Discretionary Fee Waiver	<p>You will qualify for a fee waiver if you meet the eligibility criteria and, after the relevant deductions have been made, your residual household income is £25,000 pa or under.</p> <p>NB: This does not apply to students aged 24+ attending a level 3 or 4 (non HE) programme of study, or students aged 19+ attending a second full level 3 or 4 (non HE) programme of study.</p> <p>This support is not available for students aged 19-23 who do not already hold a full level 1 or 2 qualification and wish to enrol on a course that is not designated a full level 1 or 2.</p>
Student Fund	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your household income must be less than £25,000.00 per annum for your application to be considered (evidence of this must be provided). • You must have your own bank account and be able to provide the details to receive a payment from the fund • We are unable to offer cash support to adult Asylum Seekers.
FE Meals	<p>If your household income is under/up to £25,000.00 per annum, you will be eligible for one meal a day at one college centre to the value of £3.00 each day you attend college.</p>
